They will also develop many geographical skills as they find out about the American state of Florida. With Raya helping the children to collaborate they will teach them all about our planet, its oceans, continents and countries.</p> 	<p><u>Wonderful Woodlands</u></p> <p>During this theme Aqueel will help the children learn about the animals, plants and history of our wonderful woodlands - they will collect lots of reasons why the New Forest should be protected.</p> 	<p><u>Under the Sea</u></p> <p>This theme will see the children continue their learning about habitats as they investigate some fascinating marine creatures.
